Prep Learning Web - Term 2 2025

English

Students explore how people use both speaking and writing to retell about important ideas and events from stories. They listen to a variety of narratives and examine the key events within these stories. Students explore the features that make spoken and written retell effective.

Mathematics

Students read, make and order numbers to at least 20. They recognise and name the number of objects within a collection and compare collections of objects to at least 20 using counting. They separate and combine collections up to 10. Students explore addition and subtraction using materials and counting strategies. They sequence days of the week and times of the day and connect them to familiar events and actions.

French

Students learn to use French words to describe colours and sizes of items.

The Arts

Music

Students explore the concepts of beat and rhythm, performing the beat to familiar songs.

Visual Arts

Students use art materials to explore drawing, collage and painting techniques. They create visual art works to communicate ideas.

Central Idea & Key Concepts

Through the learning in two or more subjects, the students explore the following central ideas and key concepts.

Central Idea: Central idea: Materials behave and interact in certain ways, which determine how people use them.

Key concepts: form, function

For some subjects the learning focus continues from Term 1 into Term 2, with the new learning focus starting in Term 2 Week 3.

Science

Students investigate how everyday objects can be made up of different materials and how these materials have observable properties. They learn how to pose questions and make predictions based on their experiences. Students engage in investigations and make observations safely.

Humanities & Social Sciences

Student learning in this area is experienced in Term 1 and completed in the first two weeks of Term 2.

Technologies

Students explore digital systems that help us and are part of our daily lives. They describe how they are used for different purposes.

Health & Physical Education

Students learn to use basic movement skills to control objects and move through different track and field activities.
